## Medicine in School

Please can we remind you about our policy on administering medicine in school:

- School is only able to administer medicines which have been prescribed by a GP four times a day, i.e. antibiotics.

Parents and carers will need to complete a form obtained from the office and give details and consent.

Other medicines, such as Calpol or Piriton, should be administered at home, before and after school, wherever possible.

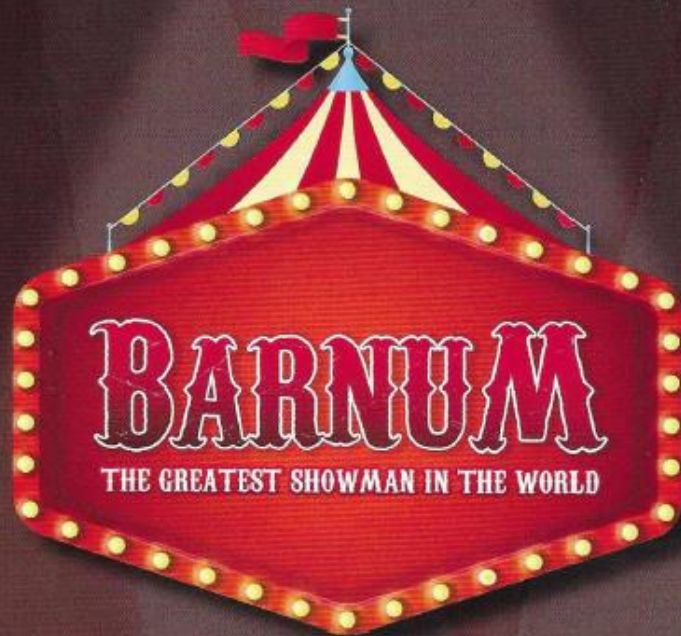
